### ► NEW ACNE THERAPY INTRODUCED

**Santa Monica, Calif.** — A device using broadband light and a vacuum can safely and effectively treat mild to severe acne vulgaris, according to a study published in the February issue of the *Journal of Drugs in Dermatology*.

Researchers looked at 56 patients with mild to severe acne, treating them between two and four times with 400 to 1,200 nm of broadband light delivered through a photopneumatic device, according to HealthDay.

Physicians rated acne clearance at 50 percent after the first treatment and 90 percent after the fourth treatment.
